

# ACCEPTED WASTE:

The Goshen Transfer Station and Recycling Facility is limited to receiving the following types of solid waste only. Certain items are accepted but **CANNOT** be thrown away as trash, demolition or metals. There are regulations for accepting certain items.

**MIXED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE**, is defined by Env-Sw 103.45, as “solid waste” generated at residences, excluding construction and demolition debris, automobile scrap and other motor vehicle waste, infectious waste, asbestos waste, contaminated soil and other absorbent media, and ash (other than ash from household stoves).

## RECYCLABLES

➔ **SORTED, SEPARATED AND CLEANED BY YOU** ➔

Food is a major contaminate so

**ALL ITEMS must be THOROUGHLY CLEANED**

**GLASS & CERAMIC BOTTLES** – covers must be removed

**METALS** - Aluminum cans (soda/beer)  
Tin cans (food cans)

**PAPER & CARDBOARD**

**NO** used paper plates, napkins or tissues.  
**NO** pizza boxes with grease stains.

**PLASTICS** – covers must be removed  
**ONLY** plastics # 1 - 8 accepted  
(check bottom of container)  
**NO** straws, plastic bags, or plastic wrap
