# September-October Librarian's Report Submitted by Alex Hess at the monthly meeting on 10/20/22

- Circulation/Catalog
  - o 69 checkouts, 68 checkins, 9 renewals, and 2 lost items
  - o 43 patrons checked something out, 32 of those were for ILLs
  - 5 new patrons/cardholders
- Most days, 1 or 2 patrons
  - o In total had 12 unique patrons, 5 of them repeat visitors
- Patron computer issues: currently having issues with accessing certain features on the public computer, especially onenote and/or word
  - o I am working on figuring this out
  - Has me wondering about more long-term tech support now that Eryc is gone and I'd like to find someone local who could help once in a while
    - First thought is to ask other library staff @ Newport and Lempster
    - Any other suggestions?
- Major weeding/acquisition still to be done
  - o 64% (3,871 items) of collection has not circulated in over 10 years
    - Goal: weed 300 items by end the of 2022
      - o Will continue working on weeding in new year
      - So far: about about 100 items
    - Bookcart status: have borrowed one from Dunbar in Grantham, is on loan until January
      - Farmington is giving us 2 full size carts!!!
        - Need to figure out how to get them here
          - Van? Truck? Meeting halfway?
      - Once we have those, I will be moving the weeding project to the front burner
        - We will have a lot of books to be discarded or donated
          - Any suggestions for where to donate ones in decent condition?
  - o Goal: Acquire a total of 250 new items by the end of 2022
    - So far: about 210
      - Definitely on track for this!
